Q 1 Please summarize the main theme of the review.

Online databases were searched from inception to October 30, 2020 to locate cross-sectional, cohort, and case-control studies focusing on the FVI and CMDs in youth (i.e., 10-18 years old).

Q 2 Please highlight the limitations and strengths.

The current systematic review serves two main purposes. First, while most of the literature on the diet-mental health relationship comes from studies in adults, this systematic review summarizes the available evidence on this focal relationship in adolescence. Secondly, this systematic review focuses on existing methodological challenges in the field of nutritional epidemiology and psychiatry, and the authors discuss how this field can be improved moving forward. One important limitation is the number of cross-sectional studies identified in the review and the subsequent inability to determined the temporal order of diet and mental disorders.

Q3 Please provide your detailed review report to the authors, structured in major and minor comments.

This was a well written systematic review which examined the relationship between fruit and vegetable intake (FVI) and common mental disorders (CMD). Table 1 outlined all of the search criteria, which was very thorough. It was important that the supplementary file 2/ PRISMA chart included the reasons why the studies were excluded. Is it possible to combine the data into a meta-analysis as well?
